A THOUSAND MILES, **EIGHTEEN YEARS AND COUNTING**

As IPF completed the eighteenth year of our summer Spiritual Formation for Diocesan Seminarians program, we decided to check the statistics for that program. The quick check revealed some interesting facts: 1,740 seminarians coming from 142 dioceses have attended our program. One statistic unveiled an amazing fact: although IPF has served nearly 80% of the dioceses in the United States, it turns out that only one diocese has sent a seminarian for each of those eighteen years.

Our statistical research revealed that the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C. has sent 64 seminarians to IPF over the past eighteen years without missing a single year! Seminarians aged 21 to 61 have made the 1000+ mile journey from Washington to Omaha—as many as seven men at a time.

The first seminarian from the Archdiocese of Washington to attend the summer program, Father Michael Dolan, was an unusual candidate. A father, grandfather



and medical doctor, Father Dolan attended Blessed Pope John XXIII National Seminary, the seminary for later vocations. He was certainly the "grandfather" of the program that sum-

mer since the next oldest of the Washington seminarians in that

class was in his twenties.

Another seminarian, also from the Archdiocese of Washington, made a 30-day retreat, the Spiritual Exercises, with Fr. John Horn, S.J. that same summer. Msgr. Rob Panke, currently the

Msgr. Panke rector of the newly-established Blessed John Paul II College Seminary in the Archdiocese of Washington, had earlier been ordained a deacon and was looking

George Aschenbrenner, SJ, recommended trying our just-launched location at Creighton University. And so, Msgr. Panke became the first seminarian to complete the 30-day retreat with IPF.

Though no diocese can rival Washington for continuity, here are some runners-up: Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston (15 years, 49 seminarians), Diocese of Sioux Falls (15 years, 41 seminarians), Archdiocese of Omaha (15 years, 36 seminarians), Diocese of Fort Worth (15 years, 33 seminarians), and Archdiocese of Indianapolis (15 years, 31 seminarians). The record for the highest number from a single diocese goes to... the Archdiocese of Newark, 78 seminarians over a period of 10 years.

We look forward to continuing to welcome the long, proud line of Washington seminarians who make the annual trek to Creighton as well as all others, from near and far!

LOVE OF THE PRIESTHOOD INSPIRES ESTATE GIFT

The Institute for Priestly Formation gratefully announces receipt of a bequest in the amount of \$83,000 from the Estate of Inez H. Throener.

Inez Throener was born in St. Charles Township outside of West Point, Nebraska in 1926. During the depression, with the corn crops so poor there was often only enough harvested to feed the animals, Inez's parents decided to have her forego high school and stay at home to work. Growing up in a home with no central heating, no indoor plumbing, and no electricity until 1948, her small family clung to each other and to their faith for strength, never missing Sunday Mass and faithfully reciting the rosary together every night. As an only child, Inez took care of her parents until their deaths in 1960 and 1961, and then went to work washing dishes and working as a cook in a café in West Point. There in 1963, she met Msgr. Paul F. Peter.

For the next 37 years Inez was the cook and housekeeper for Msgr. Peter and traveled with him from parish to parish, including 10 years at St. Cecilia's Cathedral. During these years, Inez met and fed countless newly ordained men

who were mentored by Msgr. Peter and who now pastor parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Omaha.

In 2001, shortly after the death of Msgr. Peter, Inez moved to New Cassel Retirement Center where she attended a mini-retreat for the residents conducted by Fr. John Horn S.J. and heard for the first time about IPF.


Always a great supporter of the priesthood through her work, contributions and prayers, Inez sought more information about the Institute's programs for the spiritual formation of diocesan priests. After attending the first IPF dinner, she made a gift of \$25,000, becoming the first member of the IPF Founders Club. Inez died on August 29, 2011 at the age of 85. At her wake service, in speaking of the importance of prayer in her life, her long-time friend Larry Dwyer told of Inez "attending daily mass, saying her private devotions, especially the stations of the cross, and reciting two rosaries every day. In the morning Inez said a rosary for her friends, family and various priests she had known, and in the afternoon she said a rosary for IPF. Inez was a faithful steward of her resources and a great prayer warrior for the priesthood and for IPF."

In accepting the bequest of behalf of IPF, Fr. Richard J. Gabuzda, Executive Director, expressed his gratitude for Inez's financial support and daily prayers for IPF, stating "we will honor her request and add Msgr. Paul F. Peter to the roster of priests perpetually remembered in the Pope John Paul II Fund for Priests. The legacy gift she left IPF in her Last Will and Testament means that countless seminarians and priests will be blessed through the IPF programs for many years to come. May her soul rest in peace."


IPF's relationship with NCDVD dates back to 1995 when the Institute was first being formed. IPF is deeply appreciative of being honored with this award.

When \$5,000 is donated in honor of a priest, his name will be permanently inscribed on the beautiful plaque which will be on the Wall of Honor at the Institute. A brief biography of the honored priest and a list of all donors to his account will be perpetually inscribed in the Book of Remembrance. When the Institute's new Center for Priestly Spirituality is constructed, there will be a prominent place for remembrance where the plaque and book will be placed.

Every year a Mass will be celebrated on the IPF campus in remembrance of all honored priests and listed donors.

needs of a rector as he pastors his seminary flock. The book is based on Msgr. Schlesselmann's years as rector of Cardinal Muench Seminary in the Diocese of Fargo as well as his service to the Institute for Priestly Formation as an instructor and spiritual director.

The book is divided into chapters which address the rector's role as it relates to the five identities of the priest, discussed in Blessed John Paul II's *Pastores Dabo Vobis* and the writings of St. Paul: Beloved Son, Loyal Brother, Chaste Spouse, Loving Father, and Good Shepherd. Each chapter contains Scriptural text, discussion of the chapter's theme, and reflection questions. The basic premise of the book is that Nazareth, the place where Jesus spent His seminal years with Joseph and Mary, was the first seminary, for it was there that Jesus' formation took place.

With the assistance of a generous gift from the Sullivan Foundation, the book was produced and distributed to every rector and bishop in the United States.
