Mr. Anderson gave a memorable and compelling talk about his life story as told in his recent memoir, "Meant to Be: The True Story of a Son Who Discovers He Is His Mother's Deepest Secret," a heartfelt exploration of family secrets, abandonment, abuse, identity, heredity and the triumph of the human spirit.

From Our Director...

Dear Friends,

With deep gratitude to the Lord, the Institute for Priestly Formation (IPF) celebrates its 10th Anniversary this year. We take a moment to look back to the graces that have been part of these 10 years even as we anticipate the good things that the Lord has in store for us in the coming years.

Having been founded as an Institute in 1994, courageous and generous members of Creighton's administration had agreed that a ten-week summer program for seminarians could open if IPF had at least six students. By God's grace, in May 1995, exactly six "pioneer seminarians" joined staff members on the campus of Creighton University to open the first summer program. Fr. Joe Kelly also began our Seminar for Seminary Spiritual Directors that same summer.

As plans were being formulated for the first summer program, we toured Deglman Hall on the Creighton campus, which was to be our first home. At a certain point during the tour someone said, "Wouldn't it be great if some day we could fill this hall with seminarians!" That distant but fervent hope came true within a few years. Then, having outgrown Deglman Hall, we moved to larger Swanson Hall in 2002. This summer 2004, 115 seminarians will comprise the "10th Anniversary Class."

Through the years we have been able to add more staff members who help us with our programs, including programs "on the road" September through May. A growing number of friends have generously offered prayer and financial support helping the Institute grow in ways that could never have been foreseen 10 years ago. What lies on the horizon? The Holy Spirit, who has led us in these past years, sometimes in surprising ways, will surely lead the way into the next chapter of the Institute's history. Because of growing contacts in the United States and in other countries, the Institute will surely be more involved in the formation of seminary spiritual directors and others involved in both seminary formation and ongoing formation of priests. *Our Lady of Guadalupe*, who has been a constant inspiration and guide, seems to be leading us particularly to other parts of the Americas.



To support all of this growth, a new dream has emerged on the horizon: that of an Institute for Priestly Formation Center here in Omaha that would help support the many programs and activities of the Institute's growing staff.

We invite all our friends to celebrate with us the Lord's grace which has been so abundantly poured out on the Institute throughout these past years. We also invite all of our friends to ask that the Holy Spirit, who inspired the Institute's founding ten years ago, lead and guide us according to the heart of the Good Shepherd. Next Symposium Set for March 2005



The Institute for Priestly Formation will co-sponsor a symposium with the Archdiocese of Denver/St. John Vianney Theological Seminary on March 3-6, 2005. This program, the fourth of the Institute's symposia, will focus on the theme "Interiority for Mission: Spiritual Formation for Priests of the New Evangelization." Highlighting the important role of bishops in the formation of priests, the symposium will feature as speakers Bishop Sam Aquila of Fargo, Bishop Robert Carlson of Sioux Falls, Bishop David Ricken of Cheyenne and Bishop Felipe Estevez, auxiliary bishop of Miami. Archbishop Chaput of Denver will welcome participants to the "Mile-High City."

The keynote address will be given by James Keating, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Moral Theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum. The symposium will address ways in which the spiritual formation of seminarians and ordained priests can be an "integrating element" among all of the important areas of formation. In such a vision, learning to "be with" Jesus in prayer, and on mission, frames the identity of the diocesan priest. Participants will include bishops, formation personnel and others interested in priestly formation. Local priests and seminarians from the Denver seminary will also participate. Further information and registration materials will be available in Fall 2004.

Opportunities for Giving

The Institute for Priestly Formation is a charitable organization which is exempt from income tax under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3). Gifts may be made to the Institute in a variety of ways, some of which can take effect immediately; others can be deferred until your death. The Institute welcomes the opportunity to work with you and your advisors. Here are some suggestions that may be suitable for you:

Gifts of Cash: The most popular and easiest way to give. Up to 50 percent of your adjusted gross income can be deducted with any excess deductions carried over for five additional tax years.

Gifts of Securities: A gift of appreciated stocks or bonds may be the most economical way for you to make a charitable gift.

Gifts of Real Estate: An outright gift of real estate will have similar tax benefits as a gift of appreciated securities.

Gifts of Life Insurance and Annuities: Many persons have paid-up life insurance policies or deferred annuities that no longer serve the purpose for which they were purchased. This type of gift will remove the death benefit from your estate and avoid all federal and state estate/transfer taxes upon your death. Additional income tax benefits can be available in your lifetime by assigning ownership of a life insurance policy directly to the Institute.

Gifts of Retirement Plan Assets: Retirement plan assets such as your IRA's are tax-deferred vehicles. By making the Institute a primary beneficiary of your retirement plan, burdensome taxes can be avoided, allowing you to leave other assets to your heirs with less of a tax burden for them.

Gifts through your will: There are many ways to express your gift in your Last Will & Testament or Living Revocable Trust that won't take effect until your death.

Income and Estate tax rates and rules can change from year to year. Please consult with your attorney and accountant

before making any gifts. The Institute stands ready to assist you and your advisors in considering these and other options. With careful planned giving, you may be able to support the Institute for Priestly Formation and receive important tax savings as well.
