Christ the King Church

1901 – April 6, born in Turin to Alfredo and Adélaïde Frassati

1910 – Makes his first Confession

1911 – Makes his first Communion

1913 – Start attending the Social Institute directed by Jesuits.

Becomes a daily communicant.

1914 – Enrolls in the Apostleship of Prayer, the Marian Society, and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. From this point forward, every year he makes a retreat.

1915 – Receives the Sacrament of Confirmation

1918 – Starts to study Engineering – Mining at Polytechnic University

1921 – Participates in a pro-Catholic march in Rome and is arrested after defending a priest from a group of thugs.

1922 – Becomes a Third Order Dominican taking the name Girolamo and joins the Blessed Sacrament Society.

1924 – Defends the family home from eleven fascists who broke in.

1925 – July 4, dies from complications from poliomyelitis only 6 days after contracting it.

"Other than that, I have nothing else to tell you except that my life is monotonous, but every day I understand better what a Grace it is to be Catholics. Poor unlucky those who don't have a Faith: to live without Faith, without a patrimony to defend, without a steady struggle for the Truth, is not living but existing."

"Have I perhaps lost the Faith? No, thank God, my Faith is still firm enough and so let us strengthen, let us reaffirm what is the only Joy with which one can be satisfied in this world. Every sacrifice is worthwhile if only for that; then as Catholics, we have a Love which surpasses every other love and which after that owed to God is immensely beautiful, just as our religion is beautiful. Love, which had as its advocate that Apostle who preached it daily in all his letters to the various Faithful. Charity, without which, says St. Paul, every other virtue is worthless. ... Perhaps you might tell me that it's madness to hope this; but I believe, if you pray for me a bit, that in a short time I can achieve this state in prayer."

"Thus I should wish that you too will take Holy Communion on the first of the year and so our souls, refreshed by that grace, would be united even if a great distance separates us."

- to his sister in 1921 – this was the only time that he ever pressed her for greater devotion to the faith like his own

"Dearest friend, day after day, I am waiting to find the will-power that will give me the strength to finish my last labor since I am about to harvest what I have sown. Alas the days pass and rather than noting a sign of improvement I see the persistence of the Beast in me that wins the battle with the Spirit. Only in the prayers of friends do I see any strong help for me to regain the vigor to win out over my animal nature and so I put particular faith in your prayers."
