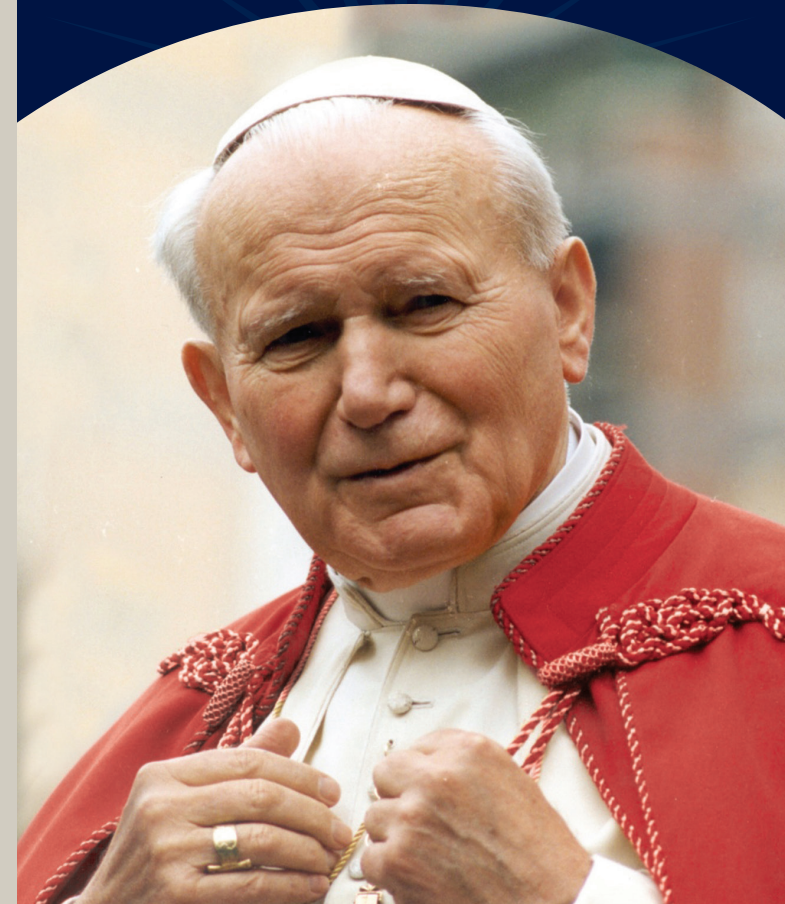

How it Works

Individuals, groups, parish communities, and organizations make donations to a particular priest's Saint John Paul II Fund account at the

Institute for Priestly Formation. This donation is made in the priest's name and supports the Institute's mission of providing spiritual formation for bishops, priests, and seminarians.

When a particular priest's Saint John Paul II Fund account reaches the minimum perpetual level of \$5,000, the priest receives the Saint John Paul II Medallion. The beautiful bronze medallion was specially created for the Institute's Saint John Paul II program. It conveys the deep appreciation of those making contributions to the Institute in a particular priest's name.

While \$5,000 is the minimum perpetual level, donations can be made after that point as well and continue the good work of both encouraging that priest and supporting the spiritual formation of other priests.

The Impact of Your Donation

Besides encouraging and uplifting a specific priest, your donations support the Institute's mission of providing spiritual formation for bishops, priests, and seminarians. Since 1994, the Institute for Priestly Formation has worked to answer the call from Saint John Paul II and the World Synod of Bishops for a more intense spiritual formation for priests and seminarians.
