
### Why We Exist

## 30 Years of **Exponential** Growth

>>> In 1994, Fr. Richard Gabuzda, Fr. George Aschenbrenner, S.J., Kathy Kanavy, and Fr. John Horn were guided by the Holy Spirit, to found IPF on the campus of Creighton University.

>>> In 1995, the Summer Program for Diocesan Seminarians began with 6 seminarians attending. By the summer of 2023,

3,390

seminarians from 157 U.S. Dioceses and 27 International Dioceses have attended the seminarian program.

>>> Seminarians and priests from 93%

of U.S. Dioceses have attended an IPF program.

>>> IPF's second program, the **Seminar for Seminary Spiritual** Directors, also began in 1995. From 1995 til 2023, it has served 309 seminary faculty, many of whom are priests.




#### - St. John Vianney IPF Founders Fund

In 2000, IPF offered its third program, the 30-Day Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. In 24 years, it has served 412 priests and seminarians.

In 2002, the Spiritual Direction Training Program had its first session with 45 participants. Demand for the program grew, and in 2014, IPF began to offer two sections at a time. Currently

priests have completed this IPF program.

>>>> Starting in 2009, IPF began to offer retreats for alumni of any IPF Program. To date,

#### 375

priests have sought out this retreat opportunity, which is offered twice a year.

>>> In 2019, IPF launched a retreat for seminarians who were about to be ordained. That first year, there were 4 seminarians. As of Feb 2024.

#### 110

seminarians have completed the **Pre-Ordination Retreat** with IPF.

- >>> IPF's latest program, the Spiritual Formation Program for Bishops, began in 2021. The three-year program and retreat finished in February 2024, serving 10 bishops.
- >>> Imagine how the Lord could continue to bless the growth of IPF's mission through this and all IPF programs!

### What about the Living Stones Building Campaign?

As of January 2024, the Living Stones Building Campaign is in the home stretch. We have raised \$2,841,057 in gifts and paid pledges. Individuals were given the option to spread their pledged amount over one to three years. Currently \$169,627 has been paid toward the pledged amount. Of the pledges to be completed this year, \$35,005 in pledges still remains. We are on track to be completed in 2024.

We often hear the question, "Is it too late to contribute to the Living Stones Campaign? And the answer is, **contributions are still being accepted**. A few projects remain that need to be completed: establishing a Building Fund for yearly maintenance, repairs, and replacement costs; purchasing artwork for the building and chapel; and future technology enhancements.






# 2023 Expenses/Revenue Charts\*


#### 2023 Institute for Priestly Formation Expenses




2023 IPF Foundation Expenses
