

Over the years at IPF, I have been privileged to see countless seminarians, priests, and bishops both renew and deepen their relationship with Christ, their hearts set on fire. You will read, in the pages ahead, how all of our work at IPF is aimed at staying close to the fire. Participants in each program receive spiritual direction from our dedicated adjunct IPF staff (hundreds of priests across the U.S. who are alumni of our programs). I am genuinely honored to serve with him, and all the adjunct IPF priests, many whom you know and enjoy as your pastor or parish priest.

St. Teresa of Avila is reported to have said, "All difficulties in prayer can be traced to one cause: praying as if God were absent." The simple, and often hidden, grace that I see at work in the lives of our IPF staff, IPF adjunct staff, and our participants is that they are renewed in their prayer life by discovering God is truly present to them. Confidence, honesty, and trust develop in their relationship with God, and that becomes a source of radiance in their ministry. We are drawn to holy people because they experience what it is like to be known by God. Their heartfelt daily prayer draws them, and us, close to the fire.

About IPF's 2024 Expenses and Revenue Charts

Elsewhere in this report, you'll find stories about how our programs are doing important work supporting the spiritual growth of seminarians, priests, and bishops. This work wouldn't be possible without the help of our generous supporters, and we want to assure you that we are also demonstrating good stewardship of the gifts we receive.

Financial results from the preliminary 2024 consolidated financial statements for IPF and the IPF Foundation are visually depicted in the pie charts below. Note that our audit is in process and will be completed in the summer of 2025, so these preliminary results are unaudited.

Direct program expenses of \$2.75 million represented approximately 76% of our total expenses, with fundraising (9%) and general and administrative


expenses (15%) bringing the total expenses to \$3.59 million.

We received approximately \$2.15 million (56% of our revenue) in the form of tuition and fees paid by program participants. Contributed support in the form of gifts and grants made up another 32%, with the remainder (12%) coming from investment earnings. The majority of those investment earnings are from assets held by our Foundation, which are used to fund grants to our programs. Total revenue was approximately \$3.84 million.


Thanks to our generous supporters and stronger-than-expected investment returns, we were able to fill the gap between program revenues and program expenses and finish 2024 with a slight surplus of approximately \$250,000. As we look ahead to 2025, we are grateful for your continued support.





The Glorious Freedom of the Children of God:

The Human Dimension of the Formation of Seminarians

This book approaches one of the four aspects of priestly formation (as outlined in Saint John Paul II's Pastores Dabo Vobis), that of human formation. The book is divided into four chapters and focuses on seminarians as: 1) human beings with a shared humanity, 2) human beings that are individual and unique, 3) young men who have already developed to a degree, and 4) young men in need of further formation and development. The formation of a seminarian's human dimension is not simply that he might be disposed to receive the graces given him at his ordination but that in and through his own humanity, he would dispose others to receive the graces God wills to grant to them.



2024 Pre-Ordination Retreat

During the Christmas break, a group of seminarians dedicated eight days to silence and prayer as a period of spiritual preparation for ordination to the priesthood or diaconate this spring. The Church stipulates that prior to ordination, each candidate should step away from the normal activities of school and service to be with the Lord in a dedicated time of retreat. To assist with this important time leading up to the man's self-gift at ordination, the Institute for Priestly Formation offers a retreat specifically for those men in formation who will become priests or deacons in the following months.

This year's ordination retreat took place at Grand Coteau Retreats in Louisiana and each participant observed silence, prayed four dedicated holy hours daily, and met one-on-one with a spiritual director each day. The focus of the retreat is the man's personal encounter with the Lord and his desire to deepen his relationship with God, not only on retreat, but throughout his life of priestly ministry. Because the time leading up to ordination is so significant, the Lord often uses the retreat as an occasion to reaffirm the man's call to the priestly life but also to establish the man in a more intimate and unique bond with Him. The Lord shows the candidate how important he is in God's eyes and how committed the Lord is to accompanying him in all that he does. This profound personal friendship with the Lord is the wellspring from which he draws strength. His service to the Church flows from this closeness to the Heart of Christ.

Concretely Encountering the Lord:

A New Cohort of the IPF Bishops Program

In early 2024, we completed our inaugural threeyear Bishops Program with ten bishops. We met with the bishops two weeks each year (during the Fall and Winter) over the course of three years. The goal of the Bishops Program is to help the bishop root all his shepherding decisions in the relationship he has with Jesus Christ. An essential part of the threeyear program is the winter component, which is an eight-day silent directed retreat. Each bishop prays four distinct hours each day, meditating on various passages from the Scriptures, and meets with a spiritual director each day to see how he and the Lord are entering into a deeper relationship. The bishops also gather for daily Mass and adoration. Otherwise, silence is maintained for the eight days, which allows the voice of God to be heard in a deeper way.

What occurs for the bishop, and really for anyone who has made a retreat in this fashion, is that the

retreatant meets the Lord in a very personal and profound way. The surprise is the concreteness of the details when encountering God the Father in prayer. The Father moves the retreatant away from thinking in abstractions about prayer and meets him in their deepest desires and matters of the heart. The retreatant discovers how near and real God is in his life. During these weeks of silent retreat, the bishops' spiritual lives are deepened, and a significant fraternal bond develops among the bishops. This affects, in a positive way, how each bishop goes about his daily tasks as shepherd of his diocese.

We are grateful to start a new cohort of the Bishops Program (which began in Fall 2024) with five new bishops. We have also invited our "alumni" bishops from the first cohort to take part, again, in the annual silent retreat this winter. It is a great honor to accompany the bishops in their spiritual lives.

More than just raising funds, we build relationships — connecting and reconnecting with seminarians, priests, faculty, volunteers, and supporters. We work closely with donors to ensure they understand IPF's needs and see the impact of their generosity. Their support is not just financial; it is a practical and empowering way to sustain the mission, ensuring IPF can continue forming priests in holiness and strengthening them in their vocation.

The goal of the event is to raise funds that support the Summer Seminarian Program and the Seminarian Pre-Ordination Retreat program.


